U.S. Delegation To Discuss Bilateral Cooperation With Comoran Government

On April 19, a U.S. delegation, led by Ms. Eunice Reddick, Director of the Office of East African Affairs at the U.S. Department of State, will be in Moroni to meet representatives of the Government of Comoros for a mixed commission to discuss bilateral cooperation on a number of issues in furtherance of our friendship and support for the government and people of the Union of the Comoros. The delegation includes Ambassador James D. McGee, First Secretary Brian Neubert, and Political Officer Silvana Rodriguez.

Following peaceful democratic elections in Comoros in 2006, the U.S. hopes to enhance the bilateral relationship, which goes both ways. Building this kind of program from scratch takes time. The U.S. has started by providing a distance learning program for educators and communities, as well as assistance in constructing and refurbishing schools through our civil affairs teams. We hope to do more in the future.

In addition to the discussions with the Government of Comoros, and in preparation for the Comoros June 10 Islands elections, on April 19 Ambassador James D. McGee will make a presentation on “U.S. Federalism” to journalists, civil society representatives, and students at the American Corner of Moroni, IFERE building.
